Clubs Available to MNMS Students

Each year, North Middle School offers a variety of clubs for student participation. All clubs, with the exception of Student Council, are open to all students. The current club structure is flexible (may change from year to year) and allows for the addition or deletion of curricular related organizations dictated by student interest and sponsor availability. The following is a list of clubs that may be available.

Art Club meets after school and creates various art projects.

Book Club reads Golden Sower Young Adult titles and writes reviews.

Chess Club learns strategic skills and competes in tournaments.

Cross Country Club practices 2-3 times a week and runs in 2-3 meets. Physical required.

Drama Club plays improvisational games, Whose Line is it Anyway games, character building activities, and work as crew members for the plays including ticket sales, props, programs, costumes and posters.

Drama/Musical presents two plays (one in the fall and one in the spring).

Forensics Club selects, prepares, memorize and performs selections of poetry, prose, plays and/or original speeches and competes in three competitions in the spring.

Games Club meets monthly after school to play various types of board games.

Jazz Band performs five concerts and plays for Honor Night.

Math Counts Club prepares for and competes in Math Counts tournament.

Outdoor Club a chance for students to learn about fishing, hunting, camping, and hiking in a hands-on engaged way

Robotics Club Students modify Ceenbot robots to prepare for the Nebraska Robotics Expo. **Student Council** meets weekly @ 7:00 a.m. and does service projects, supports Make A Wish, United Way & Omaha Food Bank, organized school activities such as Big Red party in Oct., Aloha Party in March 7/8 Winter Dance and staff appreciation breakfast.

Swing Choir performs at all 7/8 grade concerts at school.

Unified Club brings students with and without disabilities together on a daily basis to work on friendship and team building skills.

Volunteer Club helps students to serve as volunteers in the community.

Yearbook Club helps prepare our annual yearbook.

Youth to Youth NMS' drug free group. Our group focuses on creating fun drug-free activities for students in grades 6-8 and experiences during Red Ribbon Week and Get High on Life Week. Some of our activities include field trips and outings (Vala's, Zoo, Dairy Queen, Basketball games, Fun Plex), speakers, games and team building, and healthy lifestyle education.
